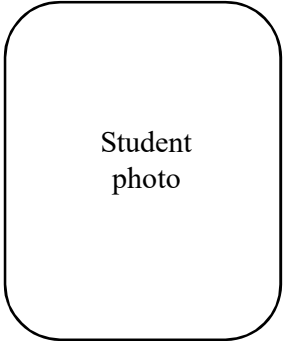

Admissions & Withdrawals

1. The Principal reserves all rights to admission without furnishing reasons.
2. Students are generally admitted at the beginning of the academic term. Admission to classes Montessori II to VI will be considered only after the Annual Examination, based on the availability of seats. Hence, no prior registration will be done.

3. For admission, Students should be introduced by their parents or proper guardians who shall remain responsible for their fees, regular attendance and good conduct.
4. Candidates will have to appear for the admission test and interview. They must come with: -
 - (a) School Leaving Certificate.
 - (b) A certified copy of the marks obtained in the last examination.
 - (c) A birth Certificate & Community Certificate is mandatory.
 - (d) EMIS and AADHAR number is mandatory for admission.

Absence from school

1. When a student is on leave without prior permission his/her parent is required to come and submit a leave letter on the same day.
2. Once in school, a student is not permitted to leave without a previously sanctioned application letter.
3. If a student falls sick, his/her leave application should be sent within 2 days. If he/she continues to be sick, a medical certificate needs to be produced. When the student re-joins the 'Medical Fitness Certificate from the same doctor must be submitted.

Discipline

Discipline in school life is very important for students. We cannot be well educated without discipline. The purpose of discipline is to develop the attitude, habits, ideas and code of conduct through the social life of the school with the cooperation of the parents and teachers. Discipline in the school is the first step in creating a learning environment which will also help the students in their future life.

Our School insists on strict punctuality, regular school attendance, cleanliness in dress, general grooming and fidelity to study and sincerity to the work assigned.

RULES OF CONDUCT

1. Every student must carry with him/her the school journal daily.
2. Students must come to school in neat and clean uniforms only.
This rule applies even when they come to school for any purpose other than attending classes even after school hours. Scribbling on the uniform or its improper wear is punishable.
3. It is compulsory to wear the school ID card every day.
4. **Entry without an ID card for students as well as parents will not be permitted. (The parents must bring their Id cards to enter the school campus)**
5. All the students must be in their seats before a teacher enters the class. When changing from one class to another, the students must move in silence and a line.
6. All the students should greet their teachers whenever they meet them. No student should use abusive/foul language against any teacher and with others.
7. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles like expensive or smart watches, cameras, mobile phones, electronic gadgets and jewellery to school. If found, such objects will be confiscated by the school authorities. The school is not responsible for any lost article.
8. Lending or borrowing money or valuable articles is strictly prohibited.
9. Students who come to the school in the care of an escort should never leave the school before he/she arrives. If they are delayed they should report to the school office.
10. After school hours students are expected to go home. They are not allowed to go to their friends' houses, for parties, games, etc. from school.

11. During recess, no student is to remain in the classroom.
12. (a) The school reserves the right to dismiss the students whose parents show little interest in the progress of their wards or whose conduct is harmful to other students/parents/staff of the school.

(b) Immorality or any objectionable activity inside or outside school premises either during or beyond school hours, dishonesty, rude or disorderly behaviour either inside or outside the school premises or willful damage to school property is always sufficient ground for immediate dismissal of a student.
13. No collection of money for any purpose whatsoever may be undertaken without the prior permission of the principal.
14. No student is permitted to be a member of any club/association without the prior permission of the principal.
15. If there is any infectious disease in the home/family, parents are expected to report the matter to the class teacher at once and not send their ward to school till the infection is controlled.
16. Sufficient care is taken for the security of the students. However, in case of a natural, accidental mishap or third-party negligence, the school shall not be held responsible.
17. During activities and outings, the school takes all necessary care and precaution. Despite this, if any accident or mishap occurs, the school will not be held responsible for the same.
- 18. Students and parents should not offer any gifts to teachers except with the prior permission of the Principal.**
19. Wearing nose pins / two or three sets of earrings/ special rings of any sorts, bangles/bracelets (for boys/girls) is not allowed. Long hair should be neatly plaited while short hair can be tied up as ponytails. Coloured hair & tattoos are not permitted.

20. Boy's hair should be short, neat and formal. Long sideburns are not allowed. Hair at the back of the neck should be clearly above the collar.
21. Care must be taken of all school property and no student should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage things belonging to others. Damage even by accident, should be reported at once to the appropriate authority. **Any damage done will be made good by the one who does it.** Anyone who sees something damaged should report the matter even if she/he does not know who has done it. Each class will be responsible for looking after all class property.
22. All waste materials should be put in the dustbins provided for the purpose.
23. Throwing stones or playing with hard balls is forbidden.
24. Bringing crackers/bursting or extending any kind of support for bursting crackers or splashing water or colour in the school premises or outside in the vicinity of the school is strictly prohibited, even during festival time. Non-compliance to these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.
25. **No student is allowed to self-drive/ride to school by motorcycle/scooter/ car, etc...** In case a student violates this rule, the school authorities will be forced to suspend him/her. The vehicle will be confiscated and will be informed to the TRAFFIC POLICE DEPARTMENT and handed over only after completing his/her studies from the school. (Students coming to the school by bicycles should refrain from the pillion.)
26. Punctuality at all times is essential. Students are expected to reach school on time. Regular late comers without a valid reason will be punished as per rule.

27. Progress cards will be given only at the Parent Teacher Meeting. Absence in PTM (when compulsory) is discouraged.
28. Remarks, whenever given in the diary should be counter-signed by the parent/ guardian only.
29. All the students must converse in English in the school premises. Conversing in English at home is appreciable.
30. During all the PTM students should come with their parents and in complete school uniform.
31. No parent is allowed to meet any teacher during school hours unless they are called by teachers. The parents can send their requests through the school diary.

Suggestions to Parents

- To secure all that is best in the education of a child, maximum co-operation between the parents and the school authorities is necessary.
- We earnestly recommend parents or guardians look into their ward's school diary every day and see to it that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day are done. (The child should be encouraged to cultivate neatness. Remarks given in the diary should be seen and counter-signed regularly).
- If you feel that your child does not make the desired progress the Principal should be contacted.
- Private tuitions are discouraged.
- **No teacher is allowed to impart private tuition.** A teacher violating the rule is liable to face action according to service norms.

- Parents/Guardians or others are not allowed to contact/meet the students or meet the teachers during class hours.
- **Criticism of a child's teacher and the school in his/her presence should be strictly avoided.** It causes the child to lose respect for the teacher, with the consequent failure to learn from him/her. If you have a legitimate complaint you may see the Principal.
- As your child grows in age, guide him/her to become a useful member at home and of the country.
- Encourage self-help for work and study.
- Children should be taught to keep their room tidy, make their beds, polish their shoes, carry their bags, etc. The formation of such habits early in life inculcates in them the idea of the dignity of work, a fundamental personal virtue, necessary for a successful career.

Norms for promotion

1. Promotion is granted based on the whole year's work and hence we lay stress on regularity in work and performance in the examination.
2. For promotion, 80% of attendance is compulsory for every student. In case of serious illness or accident, the parents/guardians are requested to inform the school authorities in time.
3. The principal with her discretion and power can bring the required attendance down to 75%

5. No grade will be awarded to a student who has been absent for any exam. No re-exam will be conducted.
6. Results declared at the end of the year are final in all classes and will not be reconsidered.

The uniform system of assessment and examination directed by the CBSE will be followed for classes I to VI in line with the other CBSE-affiliated schools.

PATTERN OF EDUCATION

Montessori

The academic year is divided into three terms. There are no formal examinations for the classes. Evaluation of the child's progress will be done based on continuous theme-based assessments, which include creative work, recitation, storytelling, etc. Progress reports will be given to the parents during the open house at the end of each term.

Standard I to VI

Art Integrated Learning

Art Integrated Learning (AIL) is a teaching-learning model which is based on learning ‘through the arts’ and ‘with the arts’: it is a process where art becomes the medium of teaching-learning, a key to understanding concepts within any subject of the curriculum.

Art needs to be integrated with the teaching and learning process of all subjects from classes 1 to 6, to promote active and experiential learning for “connecting knowledge to life outside the school, ensuring that learning shifts away from rote methods and enriching the curriculum, so that it goes beyond textbooks”

Our school includes various forms of arts with teaching (i.e.,) drawing, dance, traditional arts & games, elocution, etc. to enrich the students.

Scholastic assessments

- **Theory – 80 marks**
- **Internal Assessment (IA) – 20 marks**

IA comprises of

- Periodic Tests (PT) with a weightage of 10 marks
- Notebook submission - 5 marks
- Subject Enrichment Activities - 5 marks.

Internal Assessment emphasizes that learning is a continuous process and the acquisition of learning may be accessed through multiple approaches.

I. Periodic Test (PT) - 10 Marks

The periodic Test is a pen and paper assessment which is to be conducted by the subject teacher.

The periodic test format must have question items with a balance, such as very short answer (VSA), short answer (SA) and long answer (LA) to effectively assess the knowledge, understanding, application, skills, analysis, and evaluation and synthesis. Depending on the nature of the subject, the subject teacher will have the liberty of incorporating other types of questions. The modalities for PT are as follows:

- a) **Mode:** The periodic test is to be taken in the form of a pen and paper test.
- b) **Schedule:** In the entire academic year, three periodic tests in each Subject will be conducted as
 - ❖ **Pre Mid-term (PT-I)**
 - ❖ **Mid-Term (PT-II)**
 - ❖ **Post Mid-Term (PT - III)**
- c) **Syllabus:** The portion of the syllabus will be cumulatively covered in the periodic test concerning the announcement of the date of tests by the school.
- d) **Average of Marks:** Once the school completes the conduction of all the three periodic tests, they are required to convert the weightage of each of the three tests into ten marks each, for identifying the best two tests. The best two will be taken into consideration and the average of the two shall be the final marks for PT.

I. Notebooks Submission (5 Marks)

Notebook Submission is a compulsory part of the internal assessment carrying a weightage of five marks.

This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

II. Subject Enrichment Activities (5 Marks)

These are subject-specific activities aimed at enrichment, understanding and skill development. These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

Languages:

Aimed at equipping the learners to develop effective listening and speaking skills, the language teachers may devise their methods and parameters for the assessment of the languages.

Mathematics:

Practical work and activities in math may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT syllabus and textbooks.

Science:

Practical work and activities in Science maybe undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.

Social Science:

Map or the project work may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Book.

Co-Scholastic Activities

For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following areas must be carried out in schools by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale

(A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair).

The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork are the basic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities:

- (a) Work Education - Work Education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community

- (b) Art Education (Visual & Performing Art)
- (c) Health and Physical Education (Sports/Martial Arts/Yoga)

Discipline

The students will also be assessed for discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, respect for rules and regulations, and attitude towards society, nation and others. Grading on Discipline will be done term-wise on a 3-point grading scale

(A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair)

HOUSE SYSTEM

Four houses are set up as the four pillars of our school. They are Josephites, Marians, Florians and Teresians. Pupils will be divided into 4 different houses to project their talents and abilities and also to learn to face the real challenges of life and society. Divided they will be, yet united.

In the houses, they are expected to learn to work as a team which will enable them to excel as able leaders and be bound in thought and action realizing that “TOGETHER we can ACHIEVE great things”.

- Each house has its motto. Individually they celebrate their house feast day meaningfully.
- Each house has its flag and insignia.
- Each house is headed by a captain and a vice-captain who are guided by house staff secretaries.

Several inter-house competitions are organized during the academic year. The house gaining the highest number of points will be awarded the rolling trophy at the end of the academic year. The daily maintenance of discipline and cleanliness of the school are some of the responsibilities of the house in charge.
